Spelling Bee competition

We are launching our **Spelling Bee competition** once again at Purford Green after a break due to Covid 19.



All children will be given a list of words to learn to spell and will be required to write the words down when read aloud by an adult. These words will be **tested in the first week of the spring term** – week beginning **Monday 9th January**. Children will have all the Christmas holidays to practise.

The top five scoring children in each year group will then be given a different longer list of words to learn in January. In whole school assemblies each week, the 5 children from each year group will be tested on a selection of words to try and win the title of 'Spelling Bee Champion' for their year group.

World Café Day

It was lovely for the whole school to come together for World Café Day on 4th November. In the hall was an assortment of stalls from around the world serving up culinary delights to the children.

Each year group chose a country and spent the day finding out information about that destination and in the afternoon, all children were able to sample the foods from around the world.
